

Vin de France

100% pure Cinsault vineyard planted in the 1950s. Like « Chairacanon », it's made from a thin-skinned variety with a richer colour however and fruity aromas. For a long time, Cinsault was devoted to make rosé wines or to soften red wines but the variety used per se offers some of the finest bottles. The plot benefits from a chilly microclimate, similar in its effects to the Aramon vineyard and which also suffered from the aforementioned wine crisis. If certain policies diabolised Cinsault, it was only to give the vintage a hell of a name...



Production region: Languedoc Village of Argelliers, eastern part of the AOC Terrasses du Larzac.

Soil: limestone

Grape variety: 100% Cinsault

Harvest: manual

Vintage: 2017

Alcohol: 12,5 %

To be served: 10 - 12°C

Winemaking process:

whole bunch fermentation in tanks relying on native yeast. Very low levels of sulfite. No fining, no filtering.
